Local Strategy Partnership

The Local Strategy Partnership for the Derry City Council area is one of twenty-six Local Strategy Partnerships formed in Northern Ireland. The LSP has a strategic function, which is the development and implementation of an Integrated Local Strategy and an operational function in their responsibility for administering European grant-aid under Measures 2.11 (Area Based Regeneration) 3.1 (Developing the Social Economy) and 3.2 (Education and Training) of the PEACE II Programme. The Local Strategy Partnership for the Derry City Council area has twenty-eight members and one observer. The board meets on a bi-monthly basis and there are two sub-committees (Peace II and Strategy), which also meet on a monthly basis.

Community & Voluntary Sector Task Group (C&VSTG)

The (C&VSTG) is made up of representatives from community and voluntary sector organisations from throughout the Derry City Council area. The Task Group is facilitated by the North-West Community Network and is the mechanism through which the seven current community representatives on the LSP were elected and feedback information on the work of the Local Strategy Partnership.
