3 Swimathon Foundation grants

The Swimathon Foundation offers grants to organisations and individuals who provide and promote swimming to

their local community.

A brand new partnership has been set up to provide a grant scheme with a focus on community participation in swimming over the next four years.

The agreement brings together the knowledge and experience of the Swimming Trust and the ASA, the National Governing Body for Swimming, to manage the funding of community swimming programmes for the Swimathon Foundation. Grants will be awarded using monies raised through the Swimathon Foundation, including the high profile annual Swimathon event.

Both the Swimming Trust and the Swimathon Foundation are dedicated to delivering opportunities to enjoy swimming and to create a positive impact on the lives of individuals and communities. This new partnership will be able to utilise the expertise of the ASA in targeting communities where the grants are most needed.

Objectives of the Scheme:

Awards made through the Swimathon Community Grants aim to encourage and support organisations which increase access to swimming and provide activities aimed at helping individuals and communities enjoy the benefits of swimming throughout their lives.

Criteria

Grants from £300 to a maximum of £2,500 are available to organisations including swimming pools, operators, clubs, community organisations and charities ("Applicants") who can demonstrate how funding will allow them to help more people participate in and enjoy swimming and to make swimming more accessible.

Applicants must be able to demonstrate how funding will allow them to:

- Introduce people to swimming who would otherwise not swim, or
- Increase the frequency that existing swimmers go to the pool, or
- Improve the swimming experience for new or existing swimmers

How to Apply

All applications must be submitted using the online form. Applications received by post, fax or email will not be considered. Pools or community groups which have received a grant from the Swimathon Foundation in the last 12 months are not eligible.

4 Arts & Disability Awards Ireland 2013

Managed by the Arts & Disability Forum on behalf of the two Arts Councils of this island, the Arts & Disability Awards Ireland scheme supports individual deaf or disabled artists to produce exciting new contemporary arts work in all media

Through this funding, artists with disabilities have developed unique artwork of extremely high artistic quality, some progressing to a level where international recognition is won. Advice is available from the initial idea through to the submission of the application.

The scheme's purpose is to identify, encourage and nurture individual talent amongst disabled practitioners. Individuals can apply for up to £5,000 (or the Euro equivalent).

You may think you don't know anyone who could apply but this scheme is for all types of disabled people and all artforms. It isn't always possible to tell who is disabled and some people feel so stigmatised that they try to hide their condition. So please help your contacts towards an opportunity by spreading the word about the Arts & Disability Awards Ireland scheme.

5 The 2013 call for the LIFE+ Programme, the EU's Funding Instrument

The 2013 call for the LIFE+ Programme, the EU's funding instrument to contribute to the implementation, updating and development of environmental policy through support for pilot or demonstration projects of European added value, was launched on 19 February. Applications may be submitted under each of the programme's three components.

1. **Nature and Biodiversity** supports innovative best practice or demonstration projects on the protection, conservation, restoration, monitoring and facilitation of the functioning of natural systems or habitats, wild flora and fauna. Nature projects, which can include site-based or species-based actions, should be in line with the Birds and Habitats Directives.
2. **Environmental Policy and Governance** supports innovation or demonstration projects that contribute to the implementation of EU environment policy; develop policy ideas, methods instruments and

technologies; or support the design and implementation of new approaches to monitoring and assessing environmental status and pressures.

- 3. Information and Communication** supports projects that implement awareness raising campaigns and training on environmental issues.

Uniquely among Commission-managed programmes, LIFE+ does not necessarily require a transnational approach to project development with only 15% of the budget targeted in this direction, while it also ring-fences funding for each Member State to avail of. The indicative amount which has been provisionally apportioned to successful Irish projects on this occasion will be just over €4.23 million. It is worth noting that this allocation has been very poorly exploited since 2007 with only 7 suitable Irish applications having been approved since then (2012 decisions still pending). To judge from available figures, this means that of €19.25 million earmarked to support Irish activities over this period, in excess of €11 million has been returned to the common pot for lack of quality bids from Ireland.

The deadline for submission to the Department of Environment, Community & Local Government is 26 June – 3 months earlier than the 2012 equivalent. Approved projects would get underway no earlier than June 2014. Despite the funding relating to the current 2007-2013 funding period, no upper limit has been established on the duration of projects. No particular priorities have been set for potential Irish projects. Visit the following for further information:

Do you want to hear the history of the Gaol and of course the political segregation which took place within the Gaol? Then sign up for the free trip during Community Relations Week 2013. During the Tour you will hear about the Gaol history from when it was built in 1843-1845 and its first prisoners in 1846 until the present day. You will also get the chance to visit the underground tunnel that connected the Gaol to the Courthouse on the other side of road built in 1850. You will also visit the condemned mans cells before going to the execution room where 17 men were killed with the last execution taking place in 1961.

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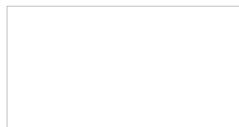
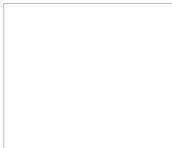
