Your grant request determines which decision meeting your application will go to. This is the combined total of your development grant (if applicable) and delivery grant.

Grant requests of over £100,000 and under £2million

Decisions are made by our committees in Northern Ireland, Wales, Scotland and England, which meet every three months. Contact your local HLF office for more information on deadline and meeting dates.

Grant requests of £2million and up to £5million

Decisions are made every two months by our Board of Trustees.

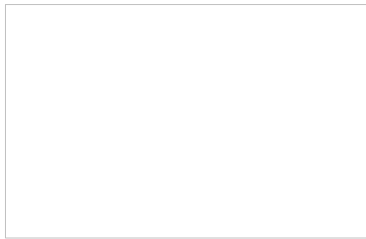

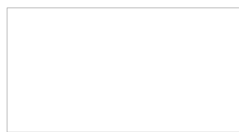
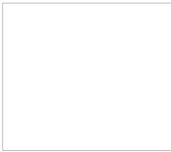
