5 Research survey - Evaluating Boards and Board members

Over the last few years, research in England, Wales and Scotland has indicated a low prevalence of board evaluation and individual board member appraisal in the voluntary and community sector. This occurs, despite recommendations for its implementation under various Codes of Good Governance, and reinforcement in practitioner and academic literature. Research has not covered Northern Ireland and it has not attempted to identify the purpose, methods and challenges encountered with these processes.

In order to explore this issue in the voluntary and community sector in Northern Ireland, the attached online survey has been prepared, as part of a Master's research study. The overall aims of the study are to:
assess the prevalence of board evaluation and individual board appraisal among boards in the voluntary and community sector in Northern Ireland;

to explore perceptions and attitudes towards evaluation/individual appraisal;

to investigate the methods currently employed; and to

identify challenges to implementation.

The survey should be completed by the CEO or Chair and should take no more than 20-25 minutes to complete.

The deadline for this survey is Friday 15 March. Please note that organisation name will only be used for analytical purposes. All organisations will be anonymous in the research report and all data will be treated as strictly confidential.

11 Drugs and Alcohol Interventions Training

Course Entrance requirement: The participant can identify to their mentor how they will use their course learning in the participant's workplace.

Course Aim: To encourage the learner to define their role in responding to alcohol/drug related harm and to develop the skills and knowledge required to fulfil that role. This skill-based course covers drug/alcohol information, development of early intervention techniques, working with carers of alcohol/drug users, harm reduction approaches, and referring on to other agencies.

Mentoring Service: The DATP will assign a mentor to each course participant. The mentor will provide you with support and advice throughout the course. To successfully complete the course, you are required to attend all sessions, submit a Reflective Learning Journal for each session and attend all mentoring sessions. If you are successful in this application, your mentor will arrange a date for you to meet. Please note, failure to meet with your mentor prior to the course start date will result in your name being withdrawn from the course and your place offered to the next name on the waiting list.

Costs: All courses are delivered free of charge to individuals living and working in the WHSSB area and are delivered to groups representing community/voluntary, health, social care, criminal justice and youth organisations.

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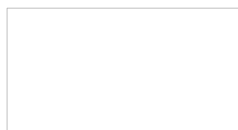
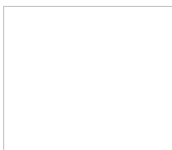
