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#### **14 DARD consultation on the Northern Ireland Rural Development Programme 2014-2020**

The DARD consultation on the Northern Ireland Rural Development Programme 2014-2020 **closes on Monday 21st October.**

It's vitally important that community and voluntary groups make their views known to the Department to help shape the next programme. The NIRDP 2014-2020 is likely to have a significantly reduced budget compared to the current Rural Development Programme. DARD officials indicated at public consultation events carried out in September across NI that it was likely that they would not have enough budget within the next Programme to fund all the schemes set out in the consultation document.

In these circumstances we think it's important that DARD hear the following messages from rural community groups:

- The Rural Development Programme is vitally important to the future sustainability of rural communities including farmers and those who have no connection to farming.
- We strongly support the priority to promote social inclusion poverty reduction and economic development in rural areas, especially in the current economic climate.
- The schemes proposed under this priority, namely, combating poverty and social isolation/basic services scheme, village renewal scheme, support for community development and capacity building, strategic services and the local community grant fund are absolutely vital to the sustainability of rural communities and need to be funded in event of a shortfall in the expected overall budget for the NIRDP 2014-2020.
- The Leader approach is valuable in responding to local need and LAGs should continue to distribute approximately 20% of the overall NIRDP budget.

It's also important that DARD hear positive messages about what the current RDP has achieved for rural communities. So if your community has benefitted (in spite of the bureaucracy and the difficulties with match funding) let DARD know the difference the RDP has made to people in your area.

London based [Resonance FM](#), 'the world's first radio art station' is coming to Void – the station will build a mobile performance space, train individuals within communities and broadcast live from Derry to Derry and from Derry to the station's half a million listeners in London. Starting from the 17 October to 13 November, for four weeks during the 2013 City of Culture celebrations. Resonance FM and Void will collaborate with International artists and the people of Derry to deliver a programme of radio broadcasts, workshops and performances that showcase the creativity, history and concerns of the city.

'We wanted to provide an alternative to the universal formula of mainstream broadcasting,' says Ed Baxter, one of Resonance's founders, 'a laboratory for wild experimentation that's available to the widest possible range of practitioners, no matter who they are. Our policy is hospitality, inviting differing perspectives that really reflect the complexity of Derry as the crossroads of ideology, opinion and society.' Many of the Derry shows will be uncategorisable forays into the unknown that stretch listeners' boundaries, summon unexpected genius and occasionally confuse the hell out of you.

'If you don't like what you hear, send us an email and do it better,' Baxter says. 'Everyone should do a radio programme at least once in their life. It's like punk rock.'

The Resonance FM @ Void project is co-curated by Ed Baxter, founder of Resonance FM, Tom Besley and Declan Sheehan of Void. The vehicle for this project is a mobile studio, built to specification in London by Resonance FM. Contained within the studio will be everything needed to facilitate the creative aspirations of a combined Resonance and Derry production team and the people of Derry. It will serve as a portal between the different parts of the city of Derry, between Derry and London, between London and the rest of the world. As well as negotiating the physical space between London and Derry and within, the mobile studio will create the context in which participants can explore conceptual spaces, bridging gaps and building networks in their thinking through discussions, performances and workshops.

At various locations throughout the Derry area, Resonance FM will have live performances, accounts of local histories, live scratch orchestra performances by the Resonance Radio Orchestra composed of new members from Derry, broadcasts that will imagine the world without the people of Derry, broadcasts that include its workers, children, citizens, artists, musicians, thinkers, and writers. A series of commissions, all specific to Derry, of radiophonic art, oral history, experimental music, and those political and artistic voices, who are under

the radar of the mainstream airwaves, will be premiered during Resonance FM's residency at Void gallery as part of Derry-Londonderry City of Culture 2013.

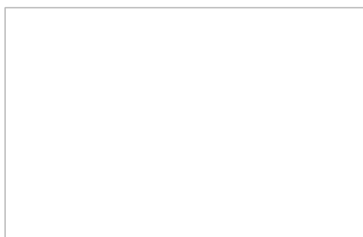

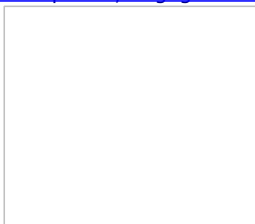

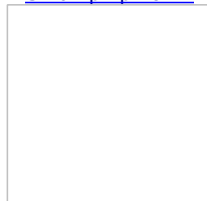
