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4 Funding for Summer Youth Intervention Programmes

The Western Education and Library Board's (WELB) Youth Service is inviting applications for funding for the provision of Summer Youth Intervention programmes which will engage young people, aged between 10 and 25 years, most at risk of becoming involved in social unrest, in a range of diversionary and developmental activities this summer.

There are two programmes of funding offered, the first of which is available for work in areas where there is anti-social behaviour or in areas where there is the potential for heightened social unrest. The maximum award under this programme is £3,000.

The second programme will fund projects for young people living in recognised interfaces and in 'hot spots', essentially areas where there has been evidence of increased or potential heightened tension. This programme is aimed at diverting young people from involvement in sectarian activities, civil disorders and other crimes during the summer period. Individual projects under this heading will attract a maximum of £6,000.

Application for support is invited from groups registered with the WELB Youth Service and from bona fide voluntary or community organisations. Applicant organisations should have experience of working with young people in a youth work setting and delivering the youth work curriculum. They should also fulfil the funding criteria, including those pertaining to Child Protection and criminal record checking of staff and volunteers. Units are required to provide a copy of their constitution, child protection policy, insurance details and bank account details. **The closing date for applications is Friday 3 May 2013 at 4.30 pm.**

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6 The Sectarian States of Ireland & Collective Action for Positive Peace – Project Launch

The Sectarian States of Ireland seminar will explore the history of sectarianism in Ireland on both sides of the border. It will look at how sectarianism within states and institutions impacts on the everyday lives of people living in Ireland. It will provide opportunities for participants to consider the ways in which sectarianism continues to manifest itself in Northern Ireland and the Border Counties and identify ways to reduce and eliminate it. Speakers include Dr. Johnston McMaster, author of *Overcoming Violence: Dismantling an Irish History and Theology* and Derek Poole from the LINC project.

The seminar is the first in a series being developed on a cross border basis by Donegal Community Workers Co-operative (DCWC), North West Community Network, Community Dialogue as part of DCWC's PEACE III funded programme. The seminar will incorporate the launch of:

Collective Action for Positive Peace

DCWC's Collective Action for Positive Peace (CAPP) project aims to work collaboratively with community workers, activists and organisations in Donegal and the Border Counties (North & South) to embed the principles of social justice and equality within peace building. Through providing training courses, seminars and newsletters and establishing two Peace Action Networks and a cross border Equality Forum the project will build linkages with both voluntary and statutory partners working to address peace and equality as well as developing policy in related areas.

Bonded labour or debt bondage is the most widely used method of enslaving people where labour is demanded as a means of repayment for a loan. The person is then tricked or trapped into working for little or no pay. Shrimati Veero, a bonded labour victim, and now campaigner, has come to the Northwest to share her story. Veero's family were tricked into taking on debts they did not owe by their landlord. Under armed guard, they had to work on the landowner's cotton farm to pay off illegitimate debt whilst living in captivity for many years. Veero finally managed to escape and saw the arrest of her landlord. Since then Veero has been campaigning for the release of slaves throughout Southern Pakistan. Karamat Ali is the founder and executive director of the Pakistan Institute for Labour Education and Research (PILER). Karamat has been one of Pakistan and South Asia's most prominent labour rights activists for four decades.

Dr. Gulam Hyder is the director of Green Rural Development Organisation (GRDO). GRDO are a partner of Trócaire in rural southern Sindh province in Pakistan, an area which was worst hit by the Pakistan floods of 2010 and 2011, and in which bonded labour is widespread problem amongst cotton workers in particular. GRDO work to free bonded labourers on cotton farms and in brick factories, through awareness raising and campaigning.

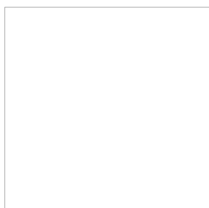

Nexus is sponsoring a visit from the Kavanagh sisters – who have shown the world their strength, courage and resiliency. Joyce, June and Paula are three sisters born to a family of ten in Ballyfermot, Dublin in the 1960s. Their father abused all three of them in the family home throughout their childhood. In 1989, the sisters made the brave decision to bring charges against their father and, in 1990, the state took a successful case against him.

The women will be speaking about the importance of raising awareness of abuse and that victims take action in ensuring it stops. The women will talk about the impact of abuse and the implications for the victims who typically blame themselves for it. It is never too late for victims to come out and prosecute those that have abused. One is never too old to be held accountable for his/her actions. It may stop them from hurting someone else.

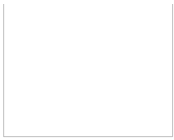
