## **8 Age Friendly City Charter Launched**

Ilex, in partnership with Derry Healthy Cities and supported by a range of older people's advisory groups, has launched the Age Friendly City Charter in a bid to make our city more age friendly.

The scheme will drive forward a campaign aimed at service providers to place older people's views and opinions at the heart of planning, design and delivery of services.

Developed under the guidance of the World Health Organisation, this programme has been successfully rolled out in Belfast, Manchester, Louth, Monaghan, Dublin, and New York.

It will include organisations signing up to an Age-Friendly City Charter, which will subsequently be displayed in businesses and public spaces, underlining each service provider's commitment to catering for the needs of older people.

Derry Healthy Cities Director Eamon O'Kane said: "Around the world cities are striving to better meet the needs of their older residents. By the year 2030, 25% of the local population will be over 65, so in response we are delighted to lead on support for the key agencies and delivery bodies in this city to develop Derry~Londonderry as an Age Friendly City. We believe that Derry will be an exemplar in its commitment to the needs and rights of older people and in harnessing the skills and experiences of our region's older population. I urge all local businesses to get in touch with us and to sign up to this Charter."

Ilex's Strategy and Regeneration Officer, Jennifer Neff, has been leading in the development and the launch of the specialist Age Friendly City Charter. She said: "Creating a more caring city is a key element of our One Plan and the Age Friendly Charter is another key milestone in achieving this goal. Businesses and service providers will be encouraged and supported to place older people at the heart of planning, delivery, usage and design. We will build on our support networks to facilitate conversations with older people and feedback their needs to service providers to drive forward our Age Friendly campaign."

June Powell, Jennifer and Kenny Bamford, agreed that more could be done to facilitate the needs of older people in Derry~Londonderry. They supported the City's plan saying: "We feel that businesses could take more practical steps to help us older folk such as putting out extra seating and allowing people to use their toilet facilities. We also think that mirrors should be more accessible in clothes shops and that there should be more seating around the city's walls. We'd love it if organisations would commit to the Age Friendly City Charter."

Have you ever wondered just who is in control of our money supply and what it means when governments say there isn't enough?

Would you be surprised to discover that around 90% of money in the world is created by private banks when they are confident enough about their profits to make loans?

As part of Transition Derry's ongoing work exploring the resilient ways communities can provide food, heat and means of exchange, we have invited American Monetary Reform campaigner Bill Still to Derry.

In 1996 Bill Still worked with a team which included Nobel Prize winning economist Milton Friedman to produce the documentary The Money Masters. This classic work on monetary reform predicted the current world economic crisis and called for an American Monetary Reform Bill.

Bill Still's 2010 documentary The Secret of Oz traced the history of money creation in the US and outlined the symbols of monetary reform in Frank L Baum's novel.

Inspired by Colm Cavanagh's work on the Derry jail, Georgia has researched the context of Cecily's death for over 10 years, reading about Derry life in the early 18th century, Bishop Nicolson and the history of St. Columb's, servants' lives, civil punishment, 18th century recipes, and customs of the privileged classes in Northern Ireland.

While much is unknown, The Cook is an imaginative treatment of the year before the execution and what led Cecily Jackson to her death.

### **About Captioning:**

Captioning converts the spoken word into text that appears on a screen by the stage. It is great for anyone who finds it hard to hear well in a theatre, or who has difficulty understanding spoken English, local accents or dialects.


