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## **1 DFID Aid Match Funding**

The Department for International Development (DFID) has launched an interim funding round for UK Aid Match, the government's scheme to match public donations to charity appeals for international development projects. ## **2 Foster launches new Tourism Events Fund**

Tourism Minister Arlene Foster today launched a new Tourism Event Funding Programme to support the local events industry.

The programme is administered by the Northern Ireland Tourist Board (NITB) and designed to drive visitor numbers, increase spend in the local economy and raise the profile of Northern Ireland as a positive place, not just to visit, but to live, work, study and invest in.

NITB has streamlined and restructured the programme to ensure it supports the further development of national and international tourism events taking place in Northern Ireland from 1 April, 2014 until 31 March, 2015.

Speaking at the launch, Arlene Foster said: "World class events are now firmly established within the tourism fabric of Northern Ireland, adding to the positive perceptions of our destination and contributing to building our international profile.

"We can already look forward to the prestigious Giro d'Italia in May 2014 and the Tall Ships returning in 2015. It is important that we keep the momentum going and look to stage further events, festivals and activities that will inspire people to come to Northern Ireland.

"The events industry has a central role to play in generating visitors. This simplified funding package presents public, private and voluntary organisations with a great opportunity to give people more reasons to come and spend their time, and their money, in Northern Ireland."

### **There are two funding streams available to event organisers through the new programme:**

**The International Tourism Events Fund** will move to a three-year rolling framework supporting major events that attract a high level of international visitors, gain international media coverage and deliver a return on investment of at least 5:1.

**The Tourism Events Sponsorship Scheme** will support national events that contribute to a specific geographical area of Northern Ireland and will have a simplified application process.

NITB will host a series of road shows in Belfast, Portrush, Londonderry, Enniskillen and Newcastle in September to provide full details on the new Tourism Event Funding Programme, which will include the changes made to this year's scheme.

Susie McCullough, Director of Business Support and Events at the Northern Ireland Tourist Board said: "Events are a very important driver in developing Northern Ireland's tourism industry. They attract tourists, spectators and event participants as well as extend the season, increase spend and lengthen the time visitors stay.

"This year, after consultation with industry and partners, we have made significant changes to the programme, including a simplified and streamlined application process. Events will benefit from greater flexibility and there will be more opportunities for new events to apply.

### **3 Foster and McCausland announce findings of third sector report**

Enterprise Minister Arlene Foster and Social Development Minister Nelson McCausland have announced the findings of a mapping exercise into the third sector in Northern Ireland.

The exercise measured the size of social economy, community and voluntary sectors and showed that there were 29,784 people employed, 46,674 volunteers and 3,821 organisations across the third sector in Northern Ireland.

The report assesses the contribution of the third sector to the Northern Ireland economy, differentiating between social economy enterprises (SEEs), community and voluntary organisations, in terms of their value in relation to economic, social and environmental impact.

It also assessed the potential of community and voluntary organisations to grow into SEEs, and the potential of SEEs to grow into larger, more established social enterprises with export potential.

Enterprise Minister Arlene Foster said: "This is further evidence of the continuing growth of the social economy sector. With this growth comes a growing contribution to the Northern Ireland economy hand in hand with a social impact within local communities which is at the core of what the sector aims to achieve".

Social Development Minister Nelson McCausland said: "This mapping research is a key Programme for Government commitment and it is pleasing to note the assessment that there is considerable potential for growth within the voluntary and community sector to move to a more business-focussed social economy model."

"The report concludes that organisations will require a range of support to make this transition and officials from both Departments will be working together to take forward the main recommendations."

**The report has ten recommendations which will help the third sector to grow. They fall into three broad categories - finance, support, awareness and promotion.**

DETI and DSD officials will be considering the recommendations, with a view to developing a joint action plan over the coming weeks.

## **12 Future Railway Investment – Report on Responses to Public Consultation**

The Department for Regional Development has published the responses received to its consultation on Future Railway Investment.

A report which summarises the responses is available on the Department's website at <http://www.drndi.gov.uk/future-railway-investment-consultation.htm> where all of the comments received can be read in full.

A total of 119 written responses were received by close of the public consultation. These comprise comments from private individuals and organisations, including those representing the interests of business and industry, community groups, older and disabled people, consumer groups, political representatives, and local authorities. A number of the responses were very detailed and well researched, professionally prepared and contained some well thought out arguments on a number of the packages presented.

Minister Danny Kennedy said: "I am absolutely committed to improving our railways. The range of responses received to the public consultation and the variety of positive preferences expressed is an indication of the wide interest and strong support for future railway investment.

"The challenge for me will be securing Executive financial support for Northern Ireland's future transport needs taking account of best value for money."

The majority of those who replied to the consultation considered that the priority in spending should be given to maintaining existing tracks and rolling stock and to introducing measures to make best use of the current rail network. This aligns with support for Packages 1 and 2 presented in the consultation document.

A Departmental spokesman said: "The Department is continuing to analyse all of the information gathered, in consultation with Translink and will bring forward a further report later in the year setting out its priorities for future railways investment up to 2035."

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


