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## **10 PFC 'In Conversation' series**

RIGHTS WATCH (UK): Pat Finucane Centre, Rath Mor Centre, **Friday 26 April 2013**, 1.00-2.15pm

"From Belfast to Basra and Back Again": Christopher Stanley, Legal Officer

In 2013 British Irish Rights Watch (BIRW) became Rights Watch (UK). This contribution to The Conversation revolves around the meaning for this change of name. In the last five years BIRW has become increasingly involved in tracking the significance of British Army human rights violations, including killing and torture, from the occupation of southern Iraq following the allied invasion of 2003 (Operation Telic) and the occupation of Northern Ireland by the British Army after 1969 (Operation Banner).

We monitored, made submissions to and analysed the Baha Mousa Inquiry and its Report; we are doing similar work in relation to the Al-Sweady Inquiry and possible further inquiries following the on-going litigation in the case of Ali-Zaki Mousa and others. We also monitored and made submissions to the Iraq Inquiry and await its Report, following the conclusion of its oral evidence hearing in February 2011.

Our work in relation to British military human rights violations in Iraq is directly related to the experience in Northern Ireland, particularly during and following Internment and we have worked with the Ballymurphy Massacre victims in addition to our high profile work into Bloody Sunday. This contribution to The Conversation will focus on the issue of state impunity for human rights violations, the role of the British military in this, the failure of investigatory and accountability procedure and the entrenchment within the MOD corporate memory of the legitimacy of practices amounting torture when suppressing the 'rebellious native'.

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

